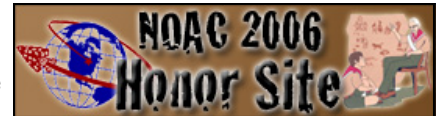

Seal Your Membership In The Brotherhood

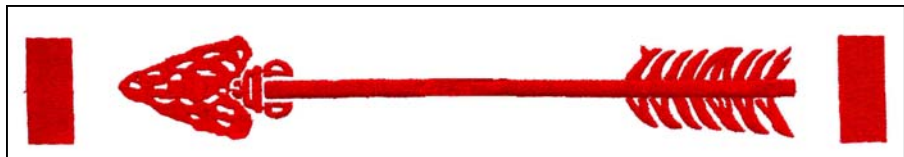
Has it been ten or more months since your ordeal? Are you willing to take the next step and seal your membership in the Order of the Arrow?

Ceremony Team News by Michael Eaton, Chairman



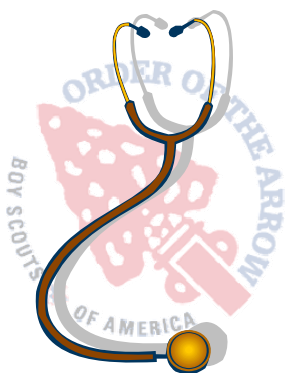

Lodge Medical Form Policy



Effective Immediately all members of the Lodge must have a completed Lodge Medical Form on file with the Health and Safety Committee in order to participate in any Lodge event. This includes Ordeal weekends, Conclave and any training weekends. The rationale behind this requirement is that it is BSA policy that in order for a person to participate in a event of

seventy two hours that they must have a medical form completed and signed by a parent or guardian if they are under the age of eighteen.

It is recommended that Lodge members complete the medical form and return it with their dues form each year. Ordeal Candidates should have received

a medical form at the time of their callout and should bring it with them to their Ordeal. A copy of the Lodge Medical form can be found on page six of this newsletter.

Patch Collector's Corner

In this issue's column we will be discussing what the importance of placing the BSA or fleur de leis on Lodge patches. There are two main reasons behind the placement of these items one patches 1) the National Council has required the placement of such marks on all patches since the early 1970's and 2) the placement of these items makes the patch an official patch of the BSA and provides protection against copyright infringement.

The second of these items is somewhat important since at this past NOAC some scrupulous patch traders made and were trading fake Talligewi

Lodge patches. Since we have placed the logo on them they have violated copyright law and if caught can be punished. Now you know the reason behind the placement of the BSA or fleur de leis on all of our Lodge patches.

We are trying to finish the Lodge Collection and need your help. We are missing the 1996, 1998, and 2004 Camp Crooked Creek Early Bird patches. If you have one of these you would like to trade or donate please contact us at info@talligewi62.org.

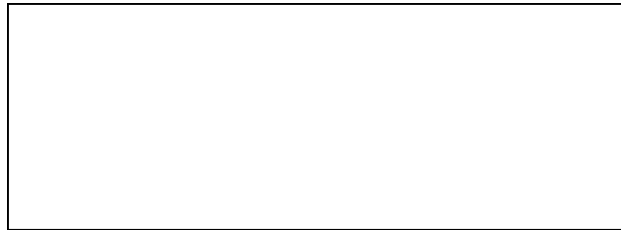
