## Winter Banquet January 7th - Holiday Inn Clarksville

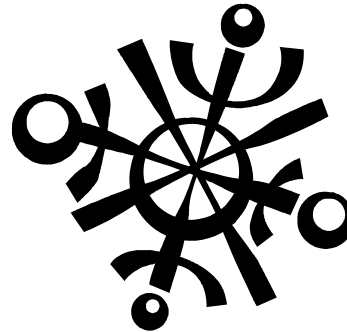

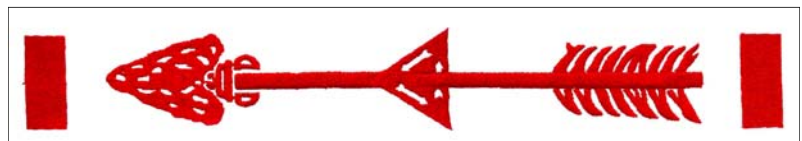

## Patch Collector's Corner

As a new feature of our Lodge Newsletter we will begin from time to time having a series of articles on that all important Scouting hobby . . . Patch Collecting! The edition's question is "What elements are required in a Lodge Flap or Patch and how does a design get approved".

The basic design elements we are looking for in a design are the Lodge Totem, the fleur de leis or BSA, an arrowhead and the use of WWW. It does not matter if these items are visible or ghosted in the design. The next item we look for is does the design fit with the theme of

the year, and is the design original. After examining all of these elements and seeing they are met the design goes to the Trading Post Committee where they examine it and make any needed corrections. From there they compare it to any other designs they have before making a recommendation to the Lodge Executive Board. The Executive Board will then approve the design and it is sent out for bids and ordered and once it arrives put out for sale in the trading post. ## Get Ready For NOAC 2006 At Michigan State

2006 is our next opportunity to attend the National Order of the Arrow Conference or NOAC for short. This is going to be the largest NOAC ever with over 14,000 Arrowmen in attendance, which is twice as big as before. From July 29th to August 3rd we will be at Michigan State University for training, fellowship, trading and growing as Arrowman. While the exact fee is not yet known it is

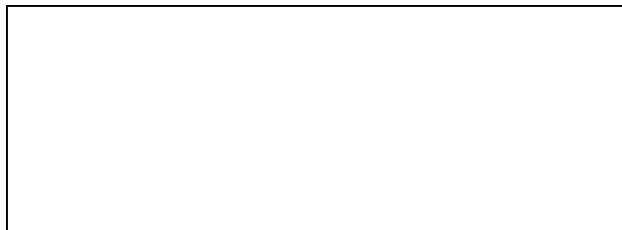
